PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Graduate Women New Zealand (GWNZ) is a not-for-profit, non-government organisation that works locally, nationally, and internationally to improve the status of women and girls through lifelong education; in particular, enabling graduate women to use their expertise to effect positive change.

Through the activities of our Branches, the Independent Members Network, and at the national level, GWNZ has established a strong record of active involvement in educational issues impacting on women and girls in New Zealand.

We are an affiliate of Graduate Women International (through which we have consultative status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations), and along with other national graduate women organisations support international efforts to enable 100% of girls and women globally to achieve education beyond primary school.

Fund raising and award ceremonies

GWNZ members support fund raising activities operated by their Branches and their associated Charitable Trusts. This funding goes towards helping graduate women access further education that will not only support their careers, but contribute to research and policy outcomes which are of benefit to the whole community.

We are very grateful for the work carried out by the branches to generate income for these awards.

Public Affairs

Our focus in 2017 remains on education opportunities for women and girls in New Zealand and internationally and we have expressed concerns when necessary on issues such as the proposed closure of Salisbury Girls' Residential School in Nelson and on intended legislation that diminishes education opportunities in countries with whom New Zealand has diplomatic relations.

We have also worked closely with the National Council of Women New Zealand (NCWNZ) and their Education Standing Committee Convenor to submit on issues such as the New Zealand Domestic Violence- Victims' Protection Bill and the draft Employment (Pay Equity and Equal Pay) Bill.

A notable feature of our participation in public affairs is the growth of our social media presence and Facebook discussions with both a closed member's only and public page.

Engagement with Graduate Women International (GWI)

GWNZ members Rae Duff and Dr Shirley Gillett respectively continue their involvement on the Graduate Women's International (GWI) Board and the Education Committee and the Otago Branch is yet another year into its twinning project building a school for girls in Sierra Leone.

GWNZ was noted for being one of the first and few affiliate countries willing, at the end of 2016, to immediately raise its financial contribution to GWI as per the agreed increase in dues, voted at the 2016 International Conference. Furthermore, `GWNZ has also contributed to the ongoing international debate on the dues with the presence of Anne Walker on the GWI ad hoc Committee now examining the sustainability of the dues.

Strategic planning and constitutional changes

Constitutional changes were approved at the 2016 Annual General Meeting and a more simplified structure put in place. Further to the changes, the National Executive is now in the process of consultation with, and feedback from, members with the aim of improving and streamlining the message our organisation gives users of our national and branch websites.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 June 2017

1. GENERAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The entity is an incorporated Society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies stated below.

The measurement base adopted is historical cost.

2. PARTICULAR ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Investments

Investments are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Receivables

Receivables are stated at their net realisable value.

Taxation

The income tax expense is calculated on interest received (including special funds) and is charged to the Statement of Financial Performance (General Fund).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

These financial statements have been prepared inclusive of GST as Graduate Women of New Zealand Incorporated is not registered for GST.

Membership Dues

Total Branch and Independent Membership Dues received for the year were \$26,691 (2016: \$31,381) and, using the divisions required by the Society, have been applied on the basis of \$11,550 collected on behalf of GWI (note 8), \$5,579 to the Travel Fund (note 10) and the remainder to the General Fund.

Branch membership dues are payable 31 July of each year.

3. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

There have been no changes in accounting policies. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

4. CHANGE OF TRADING NAME

To conform with international branding, the name of the Society was changed from The Federation of Graduate Women New Zealand Inc to Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. This is effective from 1 July 2017.

Independent Assurance Practitioners' Review Report

to the members of Graduate Women of New Zealand Incorporated

Report on the Financial Statements

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of Graduate Women of New Zealand Incorporated, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2017, the statement of financial performance consolidated funds, statement of movements in accumulated funds for the year then ended, and the notes to the financial statements that include a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Council's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Council is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the stated accounting policies adopted by the Society and for such internal controls as the Council considers are necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Assurance Practitioners' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the financial statements. We conducted our review in accordance with the International Standard on Review Engagements (New Zealand) (ISRE (NZ))2400, Review of Historical Financial Statements Performed by an Assurance Practitioner who is the not the Auditor of the Entity. ISRE (NZ) 2400 requires us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements, taken as a whole, are not prepared in all material respects in accordance with the applicable financial reporting framework. This Standard also requires us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of financial statements in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 is a limited assurance engagement. We perform procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries of management and others within the entity as appropriate, applying analytical procedures and evaluating the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioners conducting this review we have no relationship with, or interests in, Graduate Women of New Zealand Incorporated.

Conclusion

Review of 30 June 2017 financial statements

We have completed our review work on the financial statements of Graduate Women of New Zealand Incorporated for the year ended 30 June 2017 and issued an unmodified review opinion. We set out below one matter that came to our attention during the course of the review.

Missing Supplier's Invoices

We understand that the suppliers' invoices that were paid from July 2016 to October 2016 could not be located. While we have no concerns about the validity of these expenses, we highlight the need for proper filing of suppliers' invoices is crucial especially with the change in Treasurer every year. All suppliers' invoices need to be retained for up to 7 years to meet the Inland Revenue Department's requirements.

Our Review Approach

Our review procedures are tailored to our assessment of risk of material error in the financial statements. We consider accounting controls at various levels and in overall terms. Obviously we cannot in practice examine every operating activity or accounting procedure carried out by Society, nor can we substitute for management's responsibility to maintain adequate controls at all levels of operations.

As to the possibility of fraud or irregularity, we plan our review to have reasonable expectations of its disclosure if the amounts would be material to the financial statements. However, there are potentially many kinds of fraudulent or irregular activities which the review is not designed to uncover.

Required Communications

In accordance with New Zealand review standards we are required to communicate significant findings from the review. Accordingly, we advise:

- we encountered no significant difficulties in performing the review;
- there were no disagreements on accounting policies, estimates and disclosures;
- no deficiencies in internal accounting controls were noted by us;
- no unadjusted errors were noted by us;
- we did not identify any significant matters concerning related party transactions;
- there are no significant matters discussed with management that we wish to bring to your attention;
 and
- no other matters that are significant to the oversight of the financial reporting process were identified.

Further, we are not aware of any relationships between Audit Professionals Limited and Graduate Women of New Zealand Incorporated that, in our professional judgement, may reasonably be thought to impair our independence.
