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Entity Information

Type of Entity and Legal Basis:

We are an Incorporated Society under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022. The new Act requires updating the GWNZ constitution which is currently under process by the Executive.

Non-Consolidation of Associated Entities

An associated entity, Graduate Women NZ Charitable Trust [Inc. No. 1717013 and Charity Reg. No. CC10729] is controlled by the National Executive of Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. This entity files their annual return with Charities Services NZ. This associated entity is not consolidated with Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. because (i) in spite of being controlled by the National Executive of Graduate Women New Zealand Inc., all its members have been informed about, and do not object to, Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. not presenting consolidated financial statements; and (ii) both Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. and this associated entity produce financial statements that are available for public inspection, and comply with NZ PBE standards.

Entity's Purpose:

Graduate Women New Zealand was formed in 1921. Our purpose is to empower women through education. Through our relationship with Graduate Women International we are consultants to the United Nations and its agencies.

- ✓ Act: We are champions for women's rights. The work we do is an influential force for positive change.
- ✓ Connect: We provide a platform for graduate women to share ideas, information and broaden their network.

Entity structure

GWNZ is an umbrella organisation, aiming to fulfil our mission largely through the activities of our four Branches, the Graduate Women NZ Charitable Trust (see above), and Independent members. We are affiliated to Graduate Women International (GWI) and support their activities through our Convenor for International Relations. The four Branches of GWNZ, whose rules align with GWNZ, are North Shore (Auckland), Manawatu, Wellington and Otago. GWNZ also encourages membership for individual women who reside in an area where there is no Branch of GWNZ, and these form the Independent Members Network.

Entity's governance arrangements

Ten members of the National Executive are elected in each AGM. The GWNZ Council consists of members of the National Executive, together with one representative from each Branch (usually the Branch President) and the Independent Members Network Convenor.

 - Partnering with and providing support to Graduate Women Fiji, through our Convenor of International Relations
- b) Supporting women in their pursuit of knowledge.
 - Liaising with and supporting the GWNZ Charitable Trust, granting scholarships and fellowships.
 - A GWNZ Women in Governance Award 2022 -2023, to mark the Centenary of GWNZ, was awarded to Bridget Percy.

CEDAW 2023 promises to be a busy year for GWNZ advocacy both national and globally. As a state party to the Convention, the New Zealand government prepares a regular report on our implementation of the Convention, usually every four years. The NZ Government's 9th periodic report on CEDAW (2023) has just been submitted. Non-Governmental Organisations such as the National Council of Women of NZ of which GWNZ is a member, works collaboratively to produce an Alternate report for the CEDAW reporting session next year, providing a critical analysis from everyday New Zealand women's perspectives. GWNZ members contribute to this report via submissions.

- d) Offering opportunities for members to connect and build networks in New Zealand
 - Maintaining a database of 750+ contacts who receive our monthly newsletter relating to both local and international events, and invitations to 'get involved'.

Statement of Accounting Policies

a) Legal Entity

Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. is an Incorporated Society operating in accordance with the Incorporated Societies Act 2022.

b) Basis of Preparation

Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000.

All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

c) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. is not registered for GST. Therefore amounts recorded in the Performance Report are inclusive of GST (if any).

d) Income Tax

The only income tax expense for Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. is that charged on interest received and is deducted at source from each interest payment received in the year to June 2023. These revenues are reported net of tax. There was a small tax refund received at the end of June 2023.

e) Investments

Investments in Term Deposits are recorded at the book values (see Note 1).

f) Receivables

Both non-current and current receivables are recorded at historic value.

g) Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Cash Flow Statement comprise cash balances and bank balances (including term deposits).

h) Changes in Accounting Policies

There were no changes in accounting policies during the current financial year.

Report on Agreed-Upon-Procedures

Graduate Women New Zealand (GWNZ) National Executive Responsibilities

The Treasurer and National Executive are responsible for the preparation of financial reports which fairly reflects the financial transactions of GWNZ for the year ended 30 June 2023. They have requested that I undertake a set of agreed-upon-procedures with respect to these financial reports. This engagement excludes any inspection of, or opinion on, the non-financial information in these financial reports (e.g. Statement of Service Performance).

Basis of the Agreed-Upon-Procedures

I have carried out an engagement to cover these agreed-upon-procedures. The purpose is for members to receive a report on factual findings on the matters detailed below from an independent knowledgeable person. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for the adequacy or otherwise of the procedures requested. Members must form their own conclusions from the agreed upon procedures performed and the findings reported.

The procedures were performed solely to assist you in evaluating the validity of the financial reports for GWNZ for the year ended 30 June 2023. I was required to:

1. Inspect the bank records for the year ending 30 June 2023 and check the bank account has been reconciled.

2. Obtain the invoices and receipts issued by third parties and check these have been correctly recorded in the accounting information system utilizing Xero Accounting Software.

3. From the accounting information system and bank statements, check that the items recorded therein for the year ended 30 June 2023 agree with the figures in the financial report.

4. Review Minutes of Committee/Executive meetings for the correct authorization of payments.

5. Check the prior year's results to ensure a) they are included correctly in the 2023 financial report as comparative information and b) to assess potential anomalies. An anomaly is defined as a figure that is more than 10% different from the results for the prior year.

6. Obtain your assurance that no commitments have been entered into that are not recorded appropriately in the financial reports.

7. To maintain records of checks of the above procedures.

With respect to these procedures (1-6) I found that these were all correctly recorded. With respect to item 7, I have maintained records of my work.

Because the above procedures do not constitute either an audit or a review, I do not express any opinion on the information contained in the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2023 other than as above. My report is solely for your information and is not to be used for any other purpose. Other than supporting the aims and objectives of the organization I have no special relationship that would give me an interest in GWNZ.
