# **Financial Report**

## For the year ended June 30th 2022

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## Treasurer's report

Thank you for this opportunity to offer the financial report for the year ending June 30th, 2022.

#### Highlights:

- Funded a Centenary Scholarship for Pacific Island women to \$10,000 from funds previously in an over-funded reserve for the GWI annual payments (refer to Shirley Gillett's report)
- Funded a successful centenary meeting in Auckland, with mugs, notepads and pens produced as memorabilia. Well, done, North Shore! Each Branch has the remaining memorabilia to use as gifts, etc. Funds for this were drawn from the 22nd IFUW Conference Commemoration Fund (from the 1988 event, required to remain at least \$15,000; currently stands at \$15,337).
- Paid the annual GWI capitation fee of \$8490, as for the previous year.
- The deficit of \$2007 on our operations for the year was partly due to a much lower return on our investments of \$86,000, and also to unbudgeted expenses for the Mailchimp (\$1096 cf \$446 in the previous year). We paid a one-off charge of \$5750 for the expansion of the website facility to link to scholarship applications (this is after the 50% subsidy from the GWNZ Charitable Trust). The issues surrounding connecting to new independent members, some of whom only show up as subscription payments into the bank account, is continuing to be addressed by the Convenor for Independent Members.
- We incurred savings of \$500 by identifying a Report Reviewer who offered her services on a pro bono basis. This coming year we are not receiving the \$600 per annum from the three gowning branches, as decided at the last AGM. Subscriptions from independent members are around the same as previous years, but lower numbers of branch members resulted in a 9% reduction in that revenue stream.
- The ASB and Kiwibank deposits were moved over into Westpac term deposits to alleviate the increasingly complex processes surrounding changes in authority by banks.
- With no funded international travel, the Travel Fund continues to grow.

#### This coming year:

- The National Executive decided to fund a Women in Leadership grant(s) of \$5000.
- We anticipate a reduction in the Mailchimp charges.
- No further material website development expenses are budgeted this year.

This entity files their annual return with Charities Services NZ. This associated entity is not consolidated with Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. because (i) in spite of being controlled by the National Executive of Graduate Women New Zealand Inc., all its members have been informed about, and do not object to, Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. not presenting consolidated financial statements; and (ii) both Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. and this associated entity produce financial statements that are available for public

inspection, and comply with NZ PBE standards.

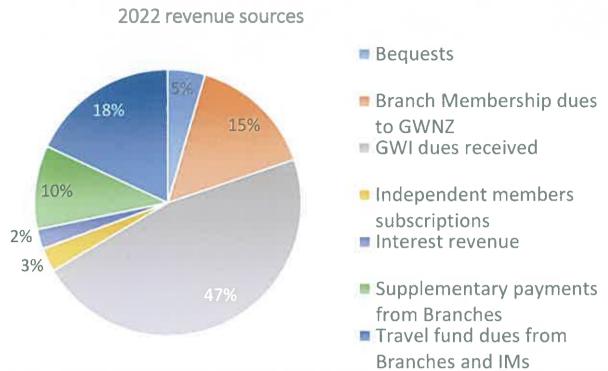

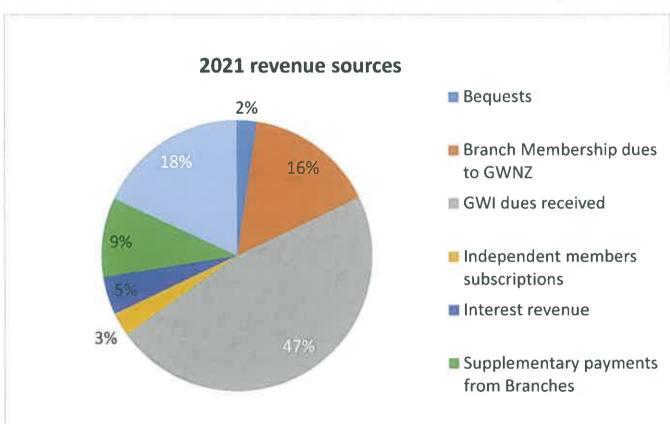

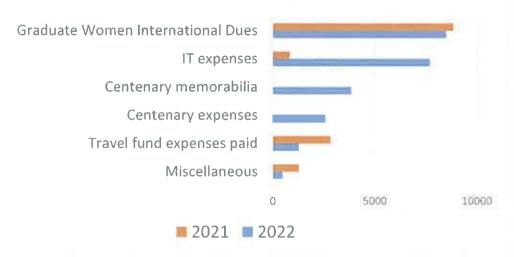

## **Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### a) Legal Entity

Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. is an Incorporated Society operating in accordance with the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 (refer to Note 9 of this document).

#### b) Basis of Preparation

Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting.

The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

#### c) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. is not registered for GST. Therefore amounts recorded in the Performance Report are inclusive of GST (if any).

#### d) Income Tax

The only income tax expense for Graduate Women New Zealand Inc. is that charged on interest received and is deducted at source from each interest payment received in the year to June 2022. These revenues are reported net of tax.

#### e) investments

Investments are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

#### f) Receivables

Non-current receivables are stated at net realisable value, and current receivables at historic value.

#### g) Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Cash Flow Statement comprise cash balances and bank balances (including term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

#### h) Changes in Accounting Policies

There were no changes in accounting policies during the current financial year.

#### Note 1: Revenues:

In 2021 \$1800 (\$600 each) was contributed from the Gowning Branches above. This is discontinued in the July 2022 -June 2023 financial year, as agreed at the AGM in October 2021.

#### Note 2: Prior period adjustment

In 2021 the \$467.33 net Taxation asset was written off as a prior period adjustment. The amount of \$16.58 this period was on a currency adjustment.

#### Note 3: Goods or Services Provided to the Entity in Kind

In 2021 the GWNZ website (set up by Zweb) was hosted by Unified Layer at no cost. In 2022 the hosting was now provided by Clic Ltd at a cost of \$92 per month (shared with GWNZ CT).

#### **Note 4: Related Party Transactions**

This Year: Matt Innes, son of President J Innes, is a Strategic Partner at Strategy Creative. Payments for services provided by Strategy Creative, being centenary memorabilia and also web site improvements (50% subsidised by the GWNZ CT), totalled \$15,331.06. There were no payments to Strategy Creative in the financial period ending June 30<sup>th</sup> 2021.

#### **Note 5: Taxation**

A change in accounting policy last year was interest payments recorded net of tax at time of receipt.

#### **Note 6: Commitments and Contingencies**

#### Commitments

There is an intended obligation by the National Executive to provide a scholarship for Women in Leadership for \$5000. There are no contractual commitments as at balance date

#### **Contingent Liabilities and Guarantees**

There are no contingent liabilities or guarantees as at balance date (Last Year - nil)

#### Appendix 1: Report on Agreed-Upon-Procedures

#### Graduate Women NZ Incorporated Executive Committee Responsibilities:

The Treasurer and Secretary are responsible for the preparation of financial reports which fairly reflects the financial transactions of Graduate Women NZ Incorporated for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022. They have requested that I undertake a set of agreed-upon-procedures with respect to these financial reports. This engagement excludes any inspection of, or opinion on, the non-financial information in these financial reports (e.g. Statement of Service Performance).

Basis of the Agreed-Upon-Procedures

I have carried out an engagement to cover these agreed-upon-procedures. The purpose is for members to receive a report on factual findings on the matters detailed below from an independent knowledgeable person. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for the adequacy or otherwise of the procedures requested. Members must form their own conclusions from the agreed upon procedures performed and the findings reported.

The procedures were performed solely to assist you in evaluating the validity of the financial reports for (Usual name) for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022. I was required to:

- 1. Access on-line bank records for the year ending 30th June 2022 and check opening and closing balances.
- 2. Obtain the invoices and any receipts issued by third parties (where applicable) and check these have been correctly recorded in the Xero accounting information system on-line.
- 3. From the accounting information system and bank information, check that the items recorded thereon for the year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022 agree with the figures in the financial report.
- 4. Check the prior year's results to ensure a) they are included correctly in the 2022 financial report as comparative information and b) to assess potential anomalies. An anomaly is defined as a prior year figure that is more than 10% different from the results for 2021.
- 5. Obtain your assurance that no commitments have been entered into that are not recorded appropriately in the financial report.
- 6. Maintain records of checks of the above procedures.

With respect to these procedures (1-5) I found that these were all correctly recorded. With respect to item 6, I have maintained records of my work.
